The prevalence of pancreatic exocrine insufficiency (PEI) in chronic pancreatitis varies with severity and duration of disease. Studies have shown 30% of people with mild pancreatitis may have PEI.¹ Ten years after the onset of chronic pancreatitis, 94% of patients may have PEI.²
