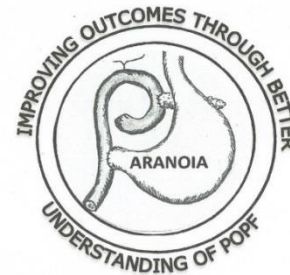

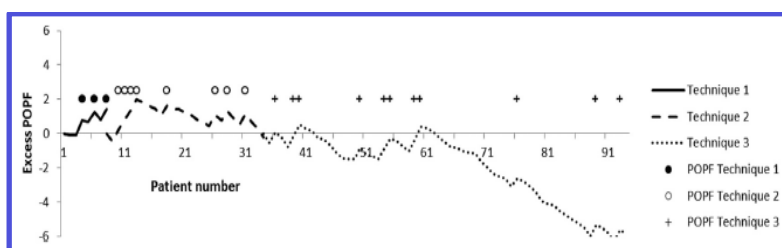
## PARANOIA: PAncReatic ANastOmosis Audit

*Don't be paranoid! Improving outcomes through better understanding of POPF*

Dear Colleague,

You are invited to take part in PARANOIA, an international registry of post-operative pancreatic fistula.

The primary aim is to give surgeons their own risk adjusted outcome data including CUSUM plots (Example: new surgeon, changing anastomosis three times in their early career)



The registry will capture key factors (anastomotic technique and patient risk factors) and provide risk scores for CR- and all-POPF. Surgeons will be able to freely explore the registry data and POPF risk factors.

By having access to risk adjusted outcomes we hope surgeons will be able to critically appraise their performance and will see the effect of changes in technique upon their POPF outcomes in real time.

The platform will offer surgeons the opportunity to propose their own, and to participate in, time-limited studies running in parallel to the core dataset, this is optional. Outputs will use a collaborative authorship model published in the name of the PARANOIA Study Group. Further information can be found on our website <https://paranoiastudy.wixsite.com/website>.

There will be a trainee registry so that surgeons in training can record their outcomes which can facilitate learning and discussion with their mentors.
